If you asked USC seniors, Alex Cwiakala and Christian Chasmer what they were doing on their weekends; they would tell you they run their own businesses while mentoring and training young hopeful entrepreneurs.

They have had the rare opportunity to become branch managers for an internship program on campus with Young Entrepreneurs Across America. YEAA is a program that trains students how to run their own small business over the summer. Christian and Alex ran their own branch of Student Painters and helped pay their way through school while employing 10-12 employees themselves.

The students develop communication and business skills through a summer of real world experience. Christian says YEAA has been one of the best learning experiences he has ever had that can't be matched by a classroom. The two students were so successful in the program they were asked to come back in leadership roles and help train students.

Last year in 2013, Alex recruited and mentored Christian while training three other managers from the university. Between the two of them this year, they are mentoring and training 11 managers who will all be running their own branch of Student Painters. Alex says "I love seeing these students transform into new people in such a short period of time".

This internship is not only just a unique opportunity for the students; it is also unique for the customers.
